

Memoir of Fallen a Hero

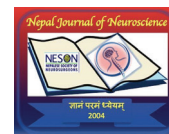

SUDEEP RAJ SINGH (1982-2022)

With the sudden demise of a young neurosurgeon Dr Sudeep Raj Singh, NESON has lost a very brilliant and young neurosurgeon in country. He succumbed to death on 14th December following sudden episodes of uncontrolled hematemesis. By the time he was hospitalized for resuscitation and ICU management, his vitals were almost unreportable. He was born in 21 Feb. 1982 and died very young at the age of 41 years. He was from a medium family and left behind a son, wife and parents (Ram Prasad Mehta and Nutan Mehta). He was born in Biratnagar where he did his schooling in St Joseph's Secondary Residential School and passed with a distinction. He finished his intermediate from Dipendra Police Higher Secondary School Kavrepalanchok. After that he did some part time job as computer teacher at Pathfinder co-ed secondary school before starting his medical carrier in institute of applied science, University of Sciences and Technology Chittagaon (USTC), Bangladesh. After passing MBBS in 2006 and finishing his internship of one year in Patan Hospital, Lalitpur, he served as resident medical officer in Patan, Nobel Hospital Kathmandu and Birat Nursing Home, Biratnagar. In 2012 he joined Banga Bandhu Shiekh Mujib Medical University (BSMMU) Dhaka, Bangladesh for MS Neurosurgery with six of his colleagues from Nepal (Bipin Chaurasia,



Ranjit Kumar Chaurasiya, Balram Neupane, Alok Dahal and Silak Chaudhary.) He became neurosurgeon in 2017. Since then he worked as a consultant neurosurgeon in B & C Teaching hospital Birtamode, Chauraha hospital Butwal, and finally Lumbini City Hospital and Medical Sciences Private Limited, Butwal.

He will be remembered for his brilliant mind and well known for his good neurosurgery skills and good way of managing patients.

His loss is not a family loss of a son, father and husband, but also a loss of nation which lost a good neurosurgeon in so young age. Many will remember him as a good, helpful and cooperative friend.

We will work to the best of our ability to honor his memory¹.
